Bobby "Blue" Bland was born Robert Calvin Bland on January 27, 1930, in Rosemark, Tennessee, a small town near Memphis. Bobby Blue Bland began his career in Memphis with B.B. King and ballad singer Johnny Ace. He has been a guest performer with B.B. King and singer-songwriter Van Morrison. Bobby was inducted into the Blues Hall of Fame in 1981 and the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1992. In 1997, he received a Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award.
