Riley B. King  
(born September 16, 1925),  
known by the stage name  
B.B. King  
Rolling Stone magazine  
ranked him at No. 6 on  
its list of the 100 greatest  
guitarists of all time.  
He is considered one  
of the most influential  
blues musicians of all time,  
because of this he is often nicknamed  
'The King of Blues'.

Over the years, King has developed  
one of the world's most identifiable  
guitar styles. He borrowed from  
Blind Lemon Jefferson,  
T-Bone Walker and others,  
integrating his precise and complex  
vocal-like string bends and his left hand vibrato,  
both of which have become  
indispensable components of rock  
guitarist's vocabulary.
